What is YOUR struggle?

- * Does your organization have the same core group that holds offices every year?
- * Does your organization struggle for participants in elections?

Election Procedures

- * Be sure your organization's election procedures are clearly stated & fair—keep the playing field level!
 - * Publicize the procedures
 - * Don't be vague—be specific!
 - * Consider a cap on campaign materials
 - * Consider a cap on campaign participants
 - * Watch for loopholes

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Recruiting

- * How do you recruit the right schools?
 - * Offer workshops on running for office
 - * Encourage schools that are energetic (and maybe new)
 - Approach advisors of schools that participate actively in awards programs, student-led workshops, summer camps, etc.

Time to SELL it!

* Advisors are often the greatest obstacles to students taking it to the next level.

Be sure that the focus is on the benefits of holding an office!

- * Leadership opportunities for students outside of their own
- * Opportunities for students to share their voices on a larger stage (make a bigger impact)
- * Opportunities for collaboration with other schools

Benefits to a Workshop

- * Consistent information shared with all
- * Opportunities to ask questions
- * Personal experiences (highs & lows) can be shared
- * Encouragement from experienced officer schools
 - * This could be extended to creating a mentor-type relationship
