


CALL FOR NCSA PRESENTERS

The National Conference on Student Activities is designed to provide program strands which encourage participation by a wide variety of activity advisors, school administrators, leadership educators, motivational speakers, and consultants. There are seven workshop strands, each meeting the needs of an array of NCSA participants. Posted at www.nawd.com are the strands and topic areas designed to encourage NCSA attendees to apply to be presenters in 2014. Potential presenters are asked to review topic areas and create a presentation based on the suggested themes. The list of topics is designed to stimulate thinking about potential presentations and not to place constraints on the creativity of the presenters.

NAWD has a tradition of using educational conference sessions as a platform for innovation in the field of student activities. In the spirit of collegial networking, NAWD seeks contributors who are willing to share their expertise without an expectation of payment.

Concurrent sessions will be held at the Chaparral Suites on December 6. Sessions are 40 minutes in length. We will have a total of twenty or more breakouts in four time slots. ***Please submit a presenter application to Jim Finnemeyer at finnemeyer@nawd.com no later than September 10, 2014.*** Decisions will be made on a rolling basis as submissions arrive.

Presenters for the 10 minute “Meet the Pros” sessions will be asked to apply when registration for NCSA attendees goes online (August-October).

A Grand Canyon Experience



Join us at 6:45 AM on **THURSDAY, December 4th** for this full day trip to the South Rim of our nation's incredible Grand Canyon. Transportation will be by van, mini-bus, or coach depending on the number of participants. The group will return to the Chaparral Suites by 9:30 PM the same evening, after a full day of unique sites and experiences.

The cost is \$150 per person. Stops will be made for lunch at the Cameron Trading Post on the Navajo Reservation. There will be a dinner stop on the return trip to the Phoenix area. The cost of these meals is NOT included in the tour price.

While at the South Rim of the Grand Canyon the tour will make designated stops including:

The Sites and Shopping of Sedona



This tour which includes picturesque sites and shopping experiences will leave the Chaparral Suites at 6:45 AM on **FRIDAY, December 5th** and will return in time for the opening NCSA social and dinner at 6:00 PM.

The cost is \$120 per person and includes a stop for lunch which is NOT included in the tour price. Transportation will be by van, mini-bus, or coach depending on the number of participants.

This experience will include a visit to the famous Jerome, Arizona, once a gold mine boom town, then ghost town, and now antique shops. The tour group will be thrown back in history to the 1100's when they visit Montezuma's Castle, built by the Sinagua Indians and one of the best preserved ancient cliff dwellings in America. At Sedona, see the Church of the Holy Cross built into the red rocks; visit Oak Creek Canyon, home of "Slide Rock"; and enjoy a unique shopping experience along the streets of Sedona. Don't forget your camera to capture some of the most photographed scenery in our nation.

Shopping at the Tempe Festival of the Arts

Take a shuttle to visit the Mill Avenue Festival of the Arts in Tempe during your NCSA experience. NCSA delegates and spouses are so lucky that this incredible arts and crafts fair will be held in nearby Tempe from December 5-7. Those delegates who attended the NCSA in 2005, may remember this multi-block arts and crafts festival. Bring along an extra suitcase, the shopping opportunities for truly unique gifts and personal items are outstanding.

Our conference hosts are providing shuttle service to and from the Arts Festival on **FRIDAY, December 5 from 9:30 AM until 4:00 PM** with time to register and attend the NCSA opening activities. OR, if you can plan for a later flight on **SUNDAY** or remain in Scottsdale for an additional day, shuttles will run **from noon to 4:00 PM** after the conference sessions. EARL REUM AWARD
Nomination Process

The Earl Reum Award began in 1991 and honors our organization's founder, Dr. Earl Reum. It is the goal of NAWD to recognize one individual in each of eight regions within the nation for their roles in leadership education and involvement in training advisors within the arena of student activities.

The nominees should be people who...

- Encourage and inspire others in the field of student leadership
- Enthusiastically share their experiences and expertise through presentations to adults
- Promote, facilitate, or create opportunities for adults to receive information to share with their students
- Are instrumental in student leadership training
- Promote student leadership within their states and/or at the national level

NAWD members are urged to seek out and nominate individuals in each region of the nation to both recognize excellence in leadership education and to encourage adults who are the "trainers of trainers".

It is recommended that an applicant/nominee for the Earl Reum Award should have previously attended a NAWD National Conference on Student Activities. A past regional Earl Reum Award winner must wait five (5) years before applying for the regional award again. Past national Earl Reum Award winners are not eligible for consideration. Either the nominator or the nominee must complete the information on the official nomination form found at www.nawd.com. The nomination form should include one letter of recommendation.

EARL REUM LEGACY

Andy Costanzo, 1997 Workshop Director of the Year Award Winner

For the past several years the Reum Legacy Series has been part of the advisors' experience at the National Student Council Conference in June. What a great way to remember and honor our mentor - the founder of NAWD!

Those of us whose lives were significantly touched by this remarkable man have been concerned that a new generation of activity advisors might not know about Earl and how he worked tirelessly to promote student activities in America. NASC is certainly to be commended for realizing this and adding the "Earl session" to the conference program.

Lori Kiblinger from Kansas, who worked with Earl for many years at the Kansas summer workshop as well as a variety of other conferences, was the presenter for this session in 2013. Lori did a terrific job of sharing numerous "Earlisms" as well as showcasing activities developed and/or presented by Earl. I was delighted and honored this past spring when Jeff Sherrill from NASC invited me to be the 2014 presenter. It was my goal to share some great Earl stories accumulated over the years, and to facilitate and process an activity that Earl would have enjoyed. I envisioned him sitting in the front row in his trademark suit holding up a number 10 - which he inevitably did, even if you botched your presentation.

It is my sincere hope that as time goes by and fewer advisors who knew Earl are still actively working with kids, NASC will continue this new national conference tradition. David Brame has created an outstanding and inspiring video piece about our hero that is a great way to start this session, and to provide advisors a glimpse of the man, the myth, the legend that is Earl Reum.
